AED (Automated External Defibrillator)

With care for member and guest safety, we have purchased an AED device for the Club. This An **automated external defibrillator (AED)** is a portable electronic device that automatically diagnoses the potentially life threatening cardiac emergencies and is able to treat them through defibrillation, the application of electrical therapy which stops the arrhythmia, allowing the heart to reestablish an effective rhythm.

With simple audio and visual commands, AEDs are designed to be simple to use for the layman. While at the building the AED is located on the east wall of front room, adjacent to the downstairs ramp and the east entrance to the back room. This provides the most access for all areas of the building. During our membership meeting, we will have a demonstration of the unit. The AED will be taken to the land when there are events and to other off-site locations.

NEW CLEAN UP STATIONS

We are sprucing up the outside of the Springfield Street Building with new "Clean Up Stations." The trash cans we have had in the past, have been wearing out, the lids get lost, and rain gets into the waste containers. So, at the urging our Cleaning Committee Chair, Leah Schiller, we have secured three clean up stations that are attached to poles that have been cemented into the ground. These stations are rain proof and present a professional image to our members and our guests. I would like to thank Leah and her husband, Rick who assembled and installed the new stations.

LEARNING GAMES by Pam Murn, Obedience Director

Puppy push-ups provide a good foundation for the basic obedience behaviors your dog will need to participate in a variety of dog sports. Your dog should be able to accomplish behaviors from any position. The behaviors and position combinations are: sit from stand, down from sit, stand from down, down from stand (sometimes called the fold back down), sit from down, and stand from sit. Teach each behavior separately and systematically. The learning game requires consistency and repetition. The behaviors do not need to be taught in any particular order. Teach all behavior in front of you (dog facing you) and beside you (in heel position). For example, to teach the sit in heel position, start by luring the dog into heel position. With the treat in your left hand raise your hand over the dog's head and slightly behind him. When he sits, mark the behavior, with your conditioned reinforcer (word, example; good or yes), and release the treat into his mouth. Pay particular attention to the order, it is important to the learning game. Be sure to mark the behavior when it occurs and before you treat the dog. Now take a few steps forward and repeat the sequence. When the dog is quickly and reliably doing the behavior each time, you are ready to add the word "sit". With your dog standing in heel position, say "sit" then raise your hand over the dog's head, repeating the rest of the sequence. Treat your dog each time he does the behavior. Your dog should be sitting quickly after a few five minute sessions. The next session, you are ready to introduce another behavior, such as the down from sit or stand from sit. Use the same system to teach all the behaviors. Treat every time when teaching a new behavior. When your dog is doing a behavior quickly and reliably each time you say the word, you are ready to remove the lure. Leave the tasty treat in your treat pouch. Be careful not to finger the treat pouch. Now say the word and then use your hand signal without a treat in your hand. When your dog does the behavior, mark the behavior with your conditioned reinforcer, then reach into your treat pouch and give the dog the treat from your hand in the position you would have given the treat had you lured the dog (important). Once you have taught all the behaviors you are ready to practice them in random order. Do not always practice puppy pushups in the same order. Dogs pattern train easily. It is important that your dog learn the word and hand signal for each position. You can make index cards and shuffle them to determine the order and play the game with your dog. After learning puppy pushups you are ready to Rally. Well, you may have to work on a little heeling, but that's another topic.
