BUILDING MAINTENANCE REPORT May 15, 2022

- 1. The new back door has been installed but not finished. The rest of the work will be done on Monday.
- 2. The General Contractor (Kenny) which we had been in contact with has decided to not do any more jobs for some time due to personal issues. We are looking for another GC to provide a quote for inside Lighting, Ceiling insulation repair, and HVAC ductwork. Two boxes of the LED bulbs have been purchased and will be stored.

ON HOLD waiting for new GC and quote

3. Obtain new light fixtures to replace lights on the outside of the building facing the parking lot and out back with 6 new LED units that are 2 to 3 times brighter. Installation to be determined.

Not ordered yet.

- 4. Improving the mud in the grass area. Four of the down spouts have been connected to the existing drain tile The remaining downspout does not appear to have an existing drain tile.

- 5. HVAC improvements: the complaint has been that the front room is always cold in the winter and the turf room gets too warm. Blower is run continuously to minimize the noise upon cycling. Discussed this with S&D Osterfeld.
 - <u>Proposal 1</u>: Install a variable speed drive for the blower system (cost \$4990)
 <u>COMPLETE</u>
 - <u>Proposal 2</u>: Install a separate heating unit for the front room to only be used in the winter. (cost \$7200). <u>Still working on a second quote.</u>
- 6. Talked with David Mancino on possible options with the building. To double the size of the matted room could cost \$200/sq ft. Think \$1,000,000
- 7. Parking lot issues: we need to re-stripe the parking spaces but we also have to do something about the deterioration of the asphalt itself. Most of the part that we use is badly cracked and breaking up. The majority of the lot needs to be capped. First estimate is that it could run \$40,000 to do from the entrance straight back to the rear corner of the building. I will try to get another quote. Recommend to do this in the early fall if possible.

Treasurer Report - May 2022

I am still behind from tax season and will get all of our paperwork updated in the next few weeks. I apologize for not having detailed reports.
