Call to Order: Meeting was called to order at 7:03 pm by Angela Profitt. Motion to accept meeting minutes from 7/6/22 was made by Sherie Heizer and seconded by Alecia Heidorn. Motion passed.

Vice President: Steve Hart. Ashley Huehn has requested use of the land on Oct. 1 for a puppy birthday party. A motion to rent the land to Ashley for 25.00 was made by Tammy Woodrow and seconded by Steve Hart. Motion passed.

Membership: Tami Woodrow. Agility, Fast Cat and Cat are using their own volunteer sheets at events and are not good at getting them to Tammy. She would like to see the volunteer sheets become consistent with the same form being used for all events. Membership is down and members are not putting in their volunteer hours. Water appears to be seeping thru the new blacktip in two places. This may be due to groundwater pressure. This will be monitored to see if it continues. The building will be closed on Sept. 20-22 for HVAC duct cleaning and sealing. He would like to get some fans to circulate the air air better. Kathy Roberts thinks there are some fans down at the land. This will be looked into. There are still problems with people operating the thermostat. The thought is that only instructors should be allowed to change the temperature. John has many projects that can be completed by volunteers. Kathy Roberts suggested a volunteer work day in the fall. Volunteers can get together on a

free Saturday that John is available and get many of these projects done. John will think about a good day and ask Chris to post an announcement.



Board Meeting - BUILDING MAINTENANCE REPORT

August 7, 2022

- 1. The plywood around the new back door has been painted. Thanks Steve!
- 2. Parking lot issues: Asphalt done. Concrete entrance repair underway.
- 3. HVAC duct cleaning and sealing. Planned for the week between classes. Sept 20-22 (Tu-W-Th). While they are in there, the building needs to be closed due to noise and equipment. Evenings should be OK. Cost \$3500
- 4. We have plans to better balance the temperature between the two rooms as well as some added air flow. Working on quotes.
- 5. The plan to installing new light fixtures to replace lights on the outside of the building facing the parking lot is being planned. Installation to be by October. <u>Not ordered yet.</u>
- 6. I would like to bring in Korrect Plumbing (or equivalent) to see if the drain tiles on the south side of the building can be opened like we had done on the north side. Then the downspouts can be plumbed to the drains instead of the grass. Approx. \$400 with parts.
- 7. Improving the mud in the grass area behind the building. When the grading behind the building was done in 2016 (?), a black plastic perforated drain pipe was installed, but that appears to be clogged and needs to be dug up and replaced. Will need to get quotes
- 8. We are looking for another GC to provide a quote for inside Lighting, and Ceiling insulation repair. Two boxes of the LED bulbs have been purchased and will be stored. ON HOLD; waiting for new GC and quote
- 9. Volunteer project: Cleaning up behind the building:

 The evergreen trees on the hill behind the building do two things. They help hold back the hill from erosion, but they also provide possible safety issues by providing potential hiding places. I propose that the trees be trimmed up to remove branches up to about seven feet. Requires volunteers and removal of branches.
- 10. Volunteer project: Plans are being made to clean up the front of building. Spray weeds, new weed barrier, replace wall, ground cover? See me if you have ideas.
- 11. Volunteer project: The club has new dog poop containers for outside that need to be installed. Old ones dug up, put new ones installed using a bucket of cement.
