New Business

Clothing

GCDOC has officially become a barn hunt club. The first step is a fun test on Sept. 9. This will prove to the barn hunt association that the club has the ability to have trials.

Land Donation

GCDOC voted at the June board meeting to donate 1,500 sq. ft. of land from Valleycrest to the city of Dayton. The road leading from Brandt Pike was a temporary road developed when the EPA closed the section of road on the opposite side due to toxic dump clean up. The residents of this road requested that the road become permanent. In order to do this the city of Dayton has to obtain land from the owners, which it is in the process of doing. They needed this 1,500 sq. ft. of land from GCDOC to complete the road. It will not affect any usage at the land. The approximate value of this land was around 250.00.

Miscellaneous

It was noticed at the last agility trial that participants were propping the back door open to bring their dogs out the back way. It was stated by John Clifford that this door is to be used as an emergency exit only. If we start using this door people will forget to lock it. A sign saying Emergency Exit Only will be placed on the back door.

The front exit door needs to stay locked. It was found unlocked on a couple of occasions in the past month. There is no reason to unlock this door, it is for exiting only.

A question was raised as to where in the building the safest spot is located in case of a tornado. It is back of the agility room. It was suggested that a sign be put up stating this.

In case of a power outage the account numbers are located in the lock box by the entrance to the agility room.
