Pre-entries cannot be acknowledged by mail but may be acknowledged by a provided legible e-mail. No phone, fax or email, late, incomplete, unsigned, unpaid or conditional entries can be accepted. Entries must be on official AKC Lure Coursing Form. **Simply complete an official AKC entry form (located at the end of this premium list) for each dog.**

Open to all dogs at least 12 months of age that are individually registered with AKC, recorded in the FSS program, dogs with PAL numbers or dogs enrolled in the AKC Canine Partners program. For more information on eligibility, check www.akc.org.



INSPECTION AND EXHIBITOR BRIEFING A briefing for exhibitors will be held prior to the running of the Coursing Ability Test. For efficiency and to accommodate schedule conflicts, a rolling schedule may be implemented. Exhibitors should check in and advise the Test Chair of any scheduling or other issues that may affect the running of their dog's test.

There will be two courses: Dogs run singularly in Coursing Ability Test events. **Veteran** dogs may run two-thirds of the normal distance at the owner's discretion. Veteran dogs are defined for this test as dogs older than 7 years of age. A veteran dog's owner must declare prior to the start which distance the dog will run.

300 Yard Course. This distance is for dogs shorter than 12 inches at the withers and/or brachycephalic ("flat-faced") dogs. A veteran dog may run 200 yards at the owner's discretion. A dog must complete this course in less than 1½ minutes.

600 Yard Course. This distance is used for all dogs that do not run the 300 yard course. A veteran dog may run 400 yards at the owner's discretion. A dog must complete this course in less than 2 minutes.

If there is a question whether a dog should run the 300 or 600 yard course, the judge will decide.

Dogs may run only one time per test. Dogs who stop running the course will not qualify.

THE COURSING TEST IS A PASS-FAIL EVENT.

The judge's decisions regarding the performance of an entered dog shall be final. Full discretionary power is given to the judge to withhold any and all qualifications for lack of merit. The Judge is responsible for ensuring compliance with the AKC Regulations on the field.

COLLARS. Dogs may wear any collar except a "choke "collar, a collar with prongs or an electronic training collar. **The safest option is no collar at all.**

INSPECTION

All dogs will be inspected for soundness prior to running the event. All bitches will be checked for being in-season. Bitches in season are not permitted to run. Inspection may NOT begin prior to the published trial hours. Immediately following close of entries, each entry will be inspected for lameness, fitness to compete, and females in season. All dogs inspected must be presented without tape, bandages or wrapping, or coverings of any kind. If, in the opinion of the inspection committee, any entry is found to be lame, unfit to compete or in season, they shall be excused from the test, and applicable entry fees shall be refunded. Substitution of dogs will be accepted at the time of roll call/inspection. Once inspection is finished, no substitution is allowed.

It is the intention of the test committee to begin running courses as soon as roll call, inspection begins and the course is ready. When you are ready to run your dog, bring them to the paddock, the assembly area for dogs that have passed inspection and are prepared to run.

The **HUNTMASTER** is responsible for field safety and therefore they are in complete charge of all dogs and handlers on the field. In service to this responsibility, they have the authority to stop the lure in any potentially dangerous situation and signal the handler to retrieve a testing dog. Listen to the Huntmaster and follow their instructions promptly.

Electronic continuous loop machines will be used. Lure consists of white plastic bags. The Field Committee reserves the right to alter the course plan as required by weather or field conditions. No one is allowed on the field without express permission of the Field Chairman. There will be a \$5 fine assessed for any loose dog not taking part in the course in progress (per the AKC). There is **NO SMOKING** in and around the paddock area or in and around the Secretary's table. Please be considerate of others.

THE AREA OF THE COURSING TEST IS FENCED.

TRIAL SCHEDULE

CAT tests will run consecutively (Test 1 followed by Test 2) on a first come, first run basis. The lure operator has requested that full course runs (600 yards) be utilized, therefore, a dog may be placed ahead of others to finish a 200, 300, or 400 yard run.

Gate opens at 8:00 AM both days.

Gate closes at start of first run. Gate traffic will be maintained by volunteers.

An orange flat ribbon will be awarded to each dog that has a qualified run in the Coursing Ability Test. A Gold and Green flat ribbon will be presented to any dog that completes a coursing title at this event.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases and have appropriate vaccinations.

Refunds: THERE SHALL BE NO REFUND for entries withdrawn after the closing date or in the event a dog and/or handler are dismissed from competition, regardless of reason for such dismissal. A dog or handler who suffers an injury and/or illness or bitches that come into season after the closing date may be eligible for a refund of their total entry fee minus a **\$10** processing fee. Written request for refund must be made to the Trial Secretary BEFORE the end of the event. Please provide documentation from your veterinarian/physician.

Entry fees may be refunded if the entered dog, upon inspection, is found to be lame, unfit to compete, or in season. No entry fees will be refunded if the event cannot be started or completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, extreme and/or dangerous weather conditions, an Act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club or its members and representatives.

Gem City Dog Agility Club's members, representatives, volunteers, etc., and the facility assume no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors, handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children or spectators.


